





Session 1 Our Climate – Climate matching game





Instructions

- 1. Split the group into pairs
- 2. Give them slides 5-9 of blank average climate conditions at five locations around the world
- 3. Using slide 3, colour each grid box according to the average climate conditions indicated in each grid box. This slide shows the locations, but in a mixed order for extra guidance.
- 4. Can they guess which location represents which set of grid boxes.
- 5. All together, they represent the climate conditions at one location.
- 6. After this task is complete, take some time to think about the differences between these climates at different locations.



Locations



- UK- climate is temperate, with relatively warm summers and mild winters.
- Sahara Desert climate is arid and therefore hot and dry, although it may get cold at night.
- Mediterranean climate is hot and dry in summer and cooler and wetter in winter.
- Antarctica climate is polar with conditions that are cold, dry and windy.
- Amazon rainforest climate is very hot and humid.







Antarctica climate is **cold, dry and windy**




Amazon rainforest climate is **hot and humid**
